

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About this manual

This manual provides service and reference information for ThinkCentre® computers listed on the front cover.

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Read this first: Important safety information

CAUTION:

Before using the computer, be sure to read and understand all the related safety information for this product. Refer to the safety information in this section and in the Safety, Warranty, and Setup Guide that you received with this product. Reading and understanding all the safety information reduces the risk of personal injury and damage to your product. Power cords and power adapters

Use only the power cords and power adapters supplied by the product manufacturer. Do not use the ac power cord for other devices.

The power cords shall be safety approved. For Germany, it shall be H03VV-F, 3G, 0.75 mm² (the power cord connected to the power adapter), H05VV-F, 3G, 0.75 mm² (the power cord connected to the internal power supply assembly), or better. For other countries, the suitable types shall be used accordingly.

Never wrap a power cord around a power adapter or other object. Doing so can stress the cord in ways that can cause the cord to fray, crack, or crimp. This can present a safety hazard.

Always route power cords so that they will not be walked on, tripped over, or pinched by objects.

Protect power cord and power adapters from liquids. For instance, do not leave your power cord or power adapter near sinks, tubs, toilets, or on floors that are cleaned with liquid cleansers. Liquids can cause a short circuit, particularly if the power cord or power adapter has been stressed by misuse. Liquids also can cause gradual corrosion of power cord terminals and/or the connector terminals on a power adapter, which can eventually result in overheating.

Ensure that all power cord connectors are securely and completely plugged into receptacles.

Do not use any power adapter that shows corrosion at the ac input pins or shows signs of overheating (such as deformed plastic) at the ac input or anywhere on the power adapter.

Do not use any power cords where the electrical contacts on either end show signs of corrosion or overheating or where the power cord appears to have been damaged in any way.

General safety

Follow these rules to ensure general safety:

Observe good housekeeping in the area of the machines during and after maintenance.

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- When lifting any heavy object:
 - 1. Ensure you can stand safely without slipping.
 - 2. Distribute the weight of the object equally between your feet.
 - 3. Use a slow lifting force. Never move suddenly or twist when you attempt to lift.
 - 4. Lift by standing or by pushing up with your leg muscles; this action removes the strain from the muscles in your back.

Attention:

Do not attempt to lift any objects that weigh more than 16 kg (35 lb) or objects that you think are too heavy for you.

- Do not perform any action that causes hazards to the customer, or that makes the equipment unsafe.
- Before you start the machine, ensure that other service representatives and the customer's personnel are not in a hazardous position.
- Place removed covers and other parts in a safe place, away from all personnel, while you are servicing the machine.
- Keep your tool case away from walk areas so that other people will not trip over it.
- Do not wear loose clothing that can be trapped in the moving parts of a machine. Ensure that your sleeves are fastened or rolled up above your elbows. If your hair is long, fasten it.
- Insert the ends of your necktie or scarf inside clothing or fasten it with a nonconductive clip, approximately 8 centimeters (3 inches) from the end.
- Do not wear jewelry, chains, metal-frame eyeglasses, or metal fasteners for your clothing. Remember: Metal objects are good electrical conductors.
- · Wear safety glasses when you are: hammering, drilling, soldering, cutting wire, attaching springs, using solvents, or working in any other conditions that might be hazardous to your eyes.
- · After service, reinstall all safety shields, guards, labels, and ground wires. Replace any safety device that is worn or defective.
- Reinstall all covers correctly before returning the machine to the customer.

CAUTION:



Keep fingers and other parts of your body away from hazardous, moving parts. If you suffer an injury, seek medical care immediately.

CAUTION:



Avoid contact with hot components inside the computer. During operation, some components become hot enough to burn the skin. Before you open the computer cover, turn off the computer, disconnect power, and wait ten minutes for the components to cool.

CAUTION:



After replacing a CRU, reinstall all protective covers, including the computer cover, before connecting power and operating the computer. This action is important to help prevent unexpected electrical shock and help ensure the containment of an unexpected fire that could happen under extremely rare conditions.

CAUTION:



When replacing CRUs, be cautious of sharp edges or corners that might cause injury. If you suffer an injury, seek medical care immediately.

Electrical safety



CAUTION:

Electrical current from power, telephone, and communication cables can be hazardous. To avoid personal injury or equipment damage, disconnect the attached power cords, telecommunication systems, networks, and modems before you open the computer covers, unless instructed otherwise in the installation and configuration procedures.

Observe the following rules when working on electrical equipment.

Important: Use only approved tools and test equipment. Some hand tools have handles covered with a soft material that does not insulate you when working with live electrical currents. Many customers have, near their equipment, rubber floor mats that contain small conductive fibers to decrease electrostatic discharges. Do not use this type of mat to protect yourself from electrical shock.

- Find the room emergency power-off (EPO) switch, disconnecting switch, or electrical outlet. If an electrical accident occurs, you can then operate the switch or unplug the power cord quickly.
- Do not work alone under hazardous conditions or near equipment that has hazardous voltages.
- Disconnect all power before:
 - Performing a mechanical inspection
 - Working near power supplies
 - Removing or installing Field Replaceable Units (FRUs)
- Before you start to work on the machine, unplug the power cord. If you cannot unplug it, power off the wall box that supplies power to the machine and lock the wall box in the off position.
- If you need to work on a machine that has exposed electrical circuits, observe the following precautions:
 - Ensure that another person, familiar with the power-off controls, is near you.
 Remember: Another person must be there to switch off the power, if necessary.
 - Use only one hand when working with powered-on electrical equipment; keep the other hand in your pocket or behind your back.
 - **Remember:** There must be a complete circuit to cause electrical shock. By observing the above rule, you may prevent a current from passing through your body.
 - When using a tester, set the controls correctly and use the approved probe leads and accessories for that tester.

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- Stand on suitable rubber mats (obtained locally, if necessary) to insulate you from grounds such as metal floor strips and machine frames.

Observe the special safety precautions when you work with very high voltages; these instructions are in the safety sections of maintenance information. Use extreme care when measuring high voltages.

- Regularly inspect and maintain your electrical hand tools for safe operational condition.
- Do not use worn or broken tools and testers.
- Never assume that power has been disconnected from a circuit. First, check that it has been powered-off.
- Always look carefully for possible hazards in your work area. Examples of these hazards are moist floors, nongrounded power extension cables, power surges, and missing safety grounds.
- Do not touch live electrical circuits with the reflective surface of a plastic dental mirror. The surface is conductive; such touching can cause personal injury and machine damage.
- Do not service the following parts with the power on when they are removed from their normal operating places in a machine:
 - Power supply units
 - Pumps
 - Blowers and fans
 - Motor generators

and similar units. (This practice ensures correct grounding of the units.)

- If an electrical accident occurs:
 - Use caution; do not become a victim yourself.
 - Switch off power.
 - Send another person to get medical aid.

Safety inspection guide

The intent of this inspection guide is to assist you in identifying potentially unsafe conditions on these products. Each machine, as it was designed and built, had required safety items installed to protect users and service personnel from injury. This guide addresses only those items. However, good judgment should be used to identify potential safety hazards due to attachment of features or options not covered by this inspection guide.

If any unsafe conditions are present, you must determine how serious the apparent hazard could be and whether you can continue without first correcting the problem.

Consider these conditions and the safety hazards they present:

- Electrical hazards, especially primary power (primary voltage on the frame can cause serious or fatal electrical shock).
- Explosive hazards, such as a damaged CRT face or bulging capacitor
- Mechanical hazards, such as loose or missing hardware

The guide consists of a series of steps presented in a checklist. Begin the checks with the power off, and the power cord disconnected.

Checklist:

- 1. Check exterior covers for damage (loose, broken, or sharp edges).
- 2. Power-off the computer. Disconnect the power cord.

- 3. Check the power cord for:
 - a. A third-wire ground connector in good condition. Use a meter to measure third-wire ground continuity for 0.1 ohm or less between the external ground pin and frame ground.
 - b. The power cord should be the appropriate type as specified in the parts listings.
 - c. Insulation must not be frayed or worn.
- 4. Remove the cover.
- 5. Check for any obvious alterations. Use good judgment as to the safety of any alterations.
- 6. Check inside the unit for any obvious unsafe conditions, such as metal filings, contamination, water or other liquids, or signs of fire or smoke damage.
- 7. Check for worn, frayed, or pinched cables.
- 8. Check that the power-supply cover fasteners (screws or rivets) have not been removed or tampered with.

Handling electrostatic discharge-sensitive devices

Any computer part containing transistors or integrated circuits (ICs) should be considered sensitive to electrostatic discharge (ESD). ESD damage can occur when there is a difference in charge between objects. To protect against ESD damage, equalize the charge between objects. Then, the machine, the part, the work mat, and the person handling the part are all at the same charge.

Notes:

- 1. Use product-specific ESD procedures when they exceed the requirements noted here.
- 2. Make sure that the ESD protective devices you use have been certified (ISO 9000) as fully effective.

When handling ESD-sensitive parts:

- Keep the parts in protective packages until they are inserted into the product.
- Avoid contact with other people while handling the part.
- Wear a grounded wrist strap against your skin to eliminate static on your body.
- Prevent the part from touching your clothing. Most clothing is insulative and retains a charge even when you are wearing a wrist strap.
- Use the black side of a grounded work mat to provide a static-free work surface. The mat is especially useful when handling ESD-sensitive devices.
- Select a grounding system, such as those listed below, to provide protection that meets the specific service requirement.

Note: The use of a grounding system is desirable but not required to protect against ESD damage.

- Attach the ESD ground clip to any frame ground, ground braid, or green-wire ground.
- Use an ESD common ground or reference point when working on a double-insulated or batteryoperated system. You can use coax or connector-outside shells on these systems.
- Use the round ground-prong of the ac plug on ac-operated computers.

Grounding requirements

Electrical grounding of the computer is required for operator safety and correct system function. Proper grounding of the electrical outlet can be verified by a certified electrician.




Figure 1. Front view

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Power indicator

This indicator is on when the computer is on.

Power button

Used to turn on your computer. When you cannot shut down the computer from the operating system, press and hold the power button for four or more seconds to turn off the computer.

Storage drive status indicator

This indicator is on when the storage drive is in use.

Microphone connector

Used to connect a microphone to your computer. You can use the microphone to record sounds or interact with the computer using speech-recognition software.

FI Headset connector

Used to connect a headset or headphones to your computer.




Figure 2. Rear view




Figure 3. System board




Figure 4. Machine type and model label

Arranging your workspace

Arrange your workspace to suit your needs and the kind of work you do. This section provides information about the factors that affect the way you arrange your workspace.

Glare and lighting

Position the monitor to minimize glare and reflections from overhead lights, windows, and other light sources. Reflected light from shiny surfaces can cause annoying reflections on your screen. When possible, place the monitor at right angles to windows and other light sources. If necessary, reduce overhead lighting by turning off lights or using lower wattage bulbs. If you install the monitor near a window, use curtains or blinds to block the sunlight. You can adjust the brightness and contrast controls on the monitor as the room lighting changes throughout the day.

Where it is impossible to avoid reflections or to adjust the lighting, an antiglare filter placed over the screen might be helpful. However, these filters might affect the clarity of the image on the screen; try them only after you have exhausted other methods of reducing glare.

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Air circulation

The computer produces heat. The computer has a fan that pulls in fresh air and forces out hot air through the air vents. Blocking the air vents can cause overheating, which might result in a malfunction or damage. Position the computer so that nothing blocks the air vents; usually, 51 mm (2 inches) of air space is sufficient. Ensure that the vented air is not blowing on people.

Electrical outlet locations and cable lengths

The following factors might determine the final placement of the computer:

- · Locations of electrical outlets
- Length of power cords or power adapters
- · Length of the cables that are connected to other devices

For more information about power cords or power adapters, see "Power cords and power adapters" on page ٧.

Comfort

Although no single working position is ideal for everyone, here are a few guidelines to help you find a position that suits you best. The following figure sets an example for your reference.



- Screen position: Keep the screen at a comfortable viewing distance, usually 51-61 cm (20-24 inches). Then, adjust the screen so that the top of the screen is at or slightly below eye level and you can view it without twisting your body.
- Chair position: Use a chair that gives you good back support and seat height adjustment. Use chair adjustments to best suit your desired posture.
- Head position: Keep your head and neck in a comfortable and neutral (vertical or upright) position.
- Arm and hand positions: Keep your forearms, wrists, and hands in a relaxed and neutral (horizontal) position. Type with a soft touch without pounding the keys.
- Leg position: Keep your thighs parallel to the floor and your feet flat on the floor or on a footrest.

Make minor modifications in your working posture to deter the onset of discomfort caused by long periods of working in the same position. Frequent, short breaks from your work also help to prevent minor discomfort associated with your working posture.

The computer provides industry-standard connectors that enable you to connect assistive devices.

TTY/TDD conversion modem

The computer supports the use of a text telephone (TTY) or the telecommunications device for the deaf (TDD) conversion modem. The modem must be connected between the computer and a TTY/TDD telephone. Then, you can type a message on the computer and send it to the telephone.

Documentation in accessible formats

Lenovo provides electronic documentation in accessible formats, such as properly tagged PDF files or HyperText Markup Language (HTML) files. Lenovo electronic documentation is developed to ensure that visually impaired users can read the documentation through a screen reader. Each image in the documentation also includes adequate alternative text so that visually impaired users can understand the image when they use a screen reader.

Cleaning the computer

CAUTION:

Remove any media from the drives and turn off all connected devices and the computer. Then, disconnect all power cords from electrical outlets and disconnect all cables that are connected to the computer.

It is a good practice to clean the computer periodically to protect the surfaces and ensure trouble-free operation. Use only mild cleaning solutions and a damp cloth to clean the painted surfaces of the computer.

Dust buildup compounds problems associated with glare, so remember to clean the screen periodically. Wipe the screen surface gently with a soft, dry cloth, or blow on the screen to remove grit and other loose particles. Depending on the type of the screen, moisten a soft, lint-free cloth with an LCD cleaner or liquid glass cleaner and then wipe the screen surface.

Maintenance

With appropriate care and maintenance, the computer will serve you reliably. This section provides information about maintaining the computer so that it can keep working in top order.

Basic maintenance tips

Here are some basic points about keeping the computer functioning properly:

- Keep the computer in a clean, dry environment. Ensure that the computer rests on a flat, steady surface.
- Do not cover any of air vents. These air vents provide airflow to keep the computer from overheating.

- · Keep food and drinks away from all parts of the computer. Food particles and spills might make the keyboard and mouse stick and unusable.
- Do not get the power switches or other controls wet. Moisture can damage these parts and cause an electrical hazard.
- Always disconnect a power cord by grasping the plug instead of the cord.

Good maintenance practices

By performing a few good maintenance practices, you can maintain good computer performance, protect your data, and be prepared in case of a computer failure.

- Empty your recycle bin on a regular basis.
- Clean out your Inbox, Sent Items, and Deleted Items folders in your e-mail application on a regular basis.
- · Clean up files and free up storage drive space and memory space occasionally to prevent performance problems.
- Back up your data on the storage drive regularly. You can restore the storage drive from a backup.

Moving the computer

Before moving the computer, take the following precautions:

- 1. Back up your data on the storage drive.
- 2. Remove any media from the drives and turn off all connected devices and the computer. Then, disconnect all power cords from electrical outlets and disconnect all cables that are connected to the computer.
- 3. If you saved the original shipping cartons and packing materials, use them to pack the units. If you are using different cartons, cushion the units to avoid damage.

Moving the computer to another country or region

When you move the computer to another country or region, you must take local electrical standards into consideration. If the local electrical outlet style is different from the type you are currently using, contact the Lenovo Customer Support Center to purchase either an electrical plug adapter or a new power cord. Attaching a Kensington-style cable lock

You can use a Kensington-style cable lock to secure your computer to a desk, table, or other nonpermanent fixture. The cable lock connects to the security-lock slot at the rear of your computer. Depending on the type selected, the cable lock can be operated with a key or combination. The cable lock also locks the buttons used to open the computer cover. 


Figure 5. Attaching a Kensington-style cable lock

Basic procedure for resolving computer problems

It is recommended that you use the following procedure to resolve computer problems you are experiencing:

- 1. Ensure that:
 - a. The cables for all connected devices are connected correctly and securely.
 - All connected devices that require ac power are connected to properly grounded, functioning electrical outlets.

If these actions do not resolve your problem, continue with the next step.

- 2. Go to "Troubleshooting" on page 17 and follow the instructions for the type of problem you are experiencing. If these troubleshooting instructions do not resolve your problem, continue with the next step.
- 3. If the problem with Ethernet cable, keyboard, mouse, power cord, power adapter, or VESA mount bracket persists, contact the Lenovo Customer Support Center. For a list of Lenovo Support phone numbers, go to http://www.lenovo.com/support/phone. For other problems, contact Amazon Helpdesk. For more information about help, service, and technical assistance, see Chapter 7 "Getting information, help, and service" on page 55.

Troubleshooting

Attention: Do not open the computer or attempt any repair before reading and understanding "Read this first: Important safety information" on page v in this document.

Use the troubleshooting information to find solutions to problems that have definite symptoms.

Startup problems

This section provides solutions to startup-related problems.

The computer does not start up when you press the power button

Solutions: Ensure that:

- The power cord is correctly connected to the rear of the computer and to a working electrical outlet.
- If the computer has a secondary power switch on the rear of the computer, ensure that it is switched on.
- The power indicator on the front of the computer is on.
- The computer voltage matches the voltage available at the electrical outlet for your country or region.

The computer beeps multiple times before the operating system starts up

Solution: Ensure that no keys are stuck.

Intermittent problems

Some problems occur only occasionally and are difficult to repeat.

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Solutions:

- Ensure that all cables and cords are securely connected to the computer and connected devices.
- Ensure that when the computer is on, the fan grill is not blocked (there is air flow around the grill), and the fans are working. If airflow is blocked or the fans are not working, the computer might overheat.
- If Small Computer System Interface (SCSI) devices are installed, ensure that the last external device in each SCSI chain is terminated correctly. For more information, see your SCSI documentation.

Screen problems

This section provides solutions to screen-related problems.

My screen goes blank while the computer is on

Solutions:

- The computer voltage matches the voltage available at the electrical outlet for your country or region.
- Press a key to exit the screen saver.
- Press the power button to resume the computer from sleep or hibernation mode.
- · The brightness and contrast is set correctly.
- If the screen goes blank when I start some application programs, install the device drivers for the application programs. Refer to the documentation for the affected application program to check whether any device drivers are required.

The image is discolored

Solution: The screen might be affected by interference from nearby equipment. Move fluorescent desk lighting or any equipment that produces magnetic fields further away from the screen. If the problem persists, do the following:

- 1. Turn off the computer.
- 2. Adjust the placement of the computer and other devices so that they are at least 305 mm (12 inches) apart.
- 3. Turn on the computer.

Networking problems

This section provides solutions to networking-related problems.

Ethernet LAN problems

My computer is a Gigabit Ethernet model and I use a speed of 1000 Mbps, but the connection fails or errors occur

Solution: Connect the network cable to the Ethernet connector using Category 5 wiring and a 100 BASE-T hub/switch (not 100 BASE-X).

My computer is a Gigabit Ethernet model, but it cannot be connected to the network at 1000 Mbps, but at only 100 Mbps

Solutions:

- Try another cable.
- Set the link partner to auto-negotiate.
- Set the switch to be 802.3ab-compliant (gigabit over copper).

Serial connector cannot be accessed

Solutions:

- Connect the serial cable to the serial connector on the computer and to the serial device. If the serial device has its own power cord, connect the power cord to a grounded electrical outlet.
- Turn on the serial device and keep the device online.
- Install any application programs supplied with the serial device. Refer to the documentation that comes with the serial device for more information.
- If you added one serial-connector adapter, install the adapter correctly.

My USB device cannot be accessed

Solutions:

- Connect the USB cable from the USB connector to the USB device. If the USB device has its own power cord, connect the power cord to a grounded electrical outlet.
- Turn on the USB device and keep the device online.
- Detach and reconnect the USB connector to reset the USB device.

Software and driver problems

This section provides solutions to software- and driver-related problems.

For some programs, dates cannot be sorted in correct order

Solution: Some programs developed before the year 2000 use only the last two digits of a year to sort dates, assuming the first two digits are 19. Consequently, dates cannot be sorted in correct order nowadays. Check with your software manufacturer to see if any updates are available. Many software manufacturers make updates available from the World Wide Web.

A device does not work normally due to device driver problems

Solution: Update the device driver. To get the latest device drivers for the computer, contact Amazon Helpdesk.

Chapter 6. Replacing hardware

This chapter provides instructions on how to replace hardware for your computer.

Before replacing hardware

Attention: Do not open the computer or attempt any repair before reading and understanding "Read this first: Important safety information" on page v in this document.

Notes before replacing hardware

- Use computer components provided only by Lenovo.
- When installing or replacing an option, use the appropriate instructions explained in this manual along with the instructions that come with the option.
- In most areas of the world, Lenovo requires the return of defective CRUs. Information about this will come with the CRU or will come a few days after the CRU arrives.

Handling static-sensitive devices

Do not open the static-protective package containing the new part until the defective part has been removed and you are ready to install the new part. Static electricity, although harmless to you, can seriously damage computer components and options.

When you handle options and other computer components, take these precautions to avoid static-electricity damage:

- Limit your movement. Movement can cause static electricity to build up around you.
- Always handle options and other computer components carefully. Handle PCI/PCIe cards, memory modules, system boards, and microprocessors by the edges. Never touch any exposed circuitry.
- Prevent others from touching the options and other computer components.
- Touch the static-protective package containing the part to a metal expansion-slot cover or other
 unpainted metal surface on the computer for at least two seconds. This reduces static electricity from the
 package and your body before you install or replace a new part.
- When possible, remove the new part from the static-protective package, and install it directly in the computer without setting the part down. When this is not possible, place the static-protective package on a smooth, level surface and place the part on the package.
- Do not place the part on the computer cover or other metal surface.

Guidelines for replacing non-CRUs

During the replacement of non-CRUs, it is recommended that you observe the following guidelines:

- 1. Connect the computer to the Internet with a static IP address, as required by Amazon.
- 2. Connect the keyboard and mouse to the computer.
- 3. Connect the computer to ac power and turn on the computer.
- 4. In the Welcome screen, click the test button at the right-bottom corner.
- 5. In the Manufacturing Tests screen, click **Switch to OS test mode**.
- 6. Select the test you need for the suspected failing part.
 - Firmware Tests: The following items will be tested automatically during the test.
 - a. Hardware information

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- b. Runtime metadata
- c. Desktop management interface (DMI)
- d. CGPT partition layout
- e. CGPT layout check
- OS Tests: Depending on the suspected failing part, select a corresponding test.
- 7. Replace the failing part. Refer to the replacing instructions for the part in this chapter.
- 8. Reconnect the computer to the Internet with a static IP address, as required by Amazon.
- 9. Reconnect the keyboard and mouse to the computer.
- 10. Reconnect the computer to ac power and turn on the computer.
- 11. In the Welcome screen, click the test button at the right-bottom corner. Then, the self-checking and manufacturing auto-testing will start automatically to verify whether the failing part has been replaced properly.

Notes:

- The manufacturing auto-testing will start automatically when the self-checking completes. The selfchecking might take around ten minutes.
- During the manufacturing auto-testing, firmware, TPM, and client ID will be tested automatically.
- If the manufacturing auto-testing fails, refer to Amazon Project Failure Handing Instruction.

Knowing FRUs (including CRUs)

- Field Replaceable Units (FRUs) are computer parts that a trained technician can upgrade or replace. FRUs include all CRUs. For detailed FRU information, such as the FRU part numbers and supported computer models, ao to:
 - http://www.lenovo.com/serviceparts-lookup
- Customer Replaceable Units (CRUs) are computer parts that a user can upgrade or replace.
 - Self-service CRUs: You can install self-service CRUs easily. These CRUs might be stand-alone, latched, or secured by up to two screws. Examples of self-service CRUs include the keyboard, mouse, any USB device. You are responsible for replacing all self-service CRUs.
 - Optional-service CRUs: Handling optional-service CRUs requires some technical skills and simple tools (such as a screwdriver). These CRUs are isolated parts within the computer. They are usually concealed by an access panel that is secured by more than two screws. You must remove the screws and panel to access the specific CRU. Optional-service CRUs can be removed and installed by users or, during the warranty period, by a Lenovo service technician.

Before replacing FRUs

Before replacing any FRU, read the following:

- Only certified and trained personnel can service the computer.
- Before replacing an FRU, read the entire section about replacing the part.
- Be extremely careful during writing operations such as copying, saving, or formatting.
 - The sequence of the drives in the computer that you are servicing might have been altered. If you select an incorrect drive, data or programs might be overwritten.
- Replace an FRU only with another FRU of the correct model.
 - When you replace an FRU, ensure that the model of the machine and the FRU part number are correct.
- An FRU should not be replaced because of a single, unreproducible failure.

Single failures can occur for a variety of reasons that have nothing to do with a hardware defect, such as cosmic radiation, electrostatic discharge, or software errors. Consider replacing an FRU only when a problem recurs. If you suspect that an FRU is defective, clear the error log and run the test again. If the error does not recur, do not replace the FRU.

• Only replace a defective FRU.




Figure 6. Locating FRUs (including CRUs)




Figure 7. Replacing the keyboard or mouse




Figure 8. Removing the power adapter




Figure 9. Removing the power cord




Figure 10. Installing the power cord




Figure 11. Installing the power adapter




Figure 12. Removing the VESA mount bracket




Figure 13. Installing the VESA mount bracket




Figure 14. Removing the dust shield




Figure 15. Removing the computer cover




Figure 16. Removing the storage drive bracket




Figure 17. Removing the storage drive




Figure 18. Installing the storage drive




Figure 19. Installing the storage drive bracket




Figure 20. Removing the internal speaker




Figure 21. Installing the internal speaker




Figure 22. Removing the system fan




Figure 23. Installing the system fan




Figure 24. Removing the Wi-Fi card shield




Figure 25. Disconnecting the Wi-Fi antennas




Figure 27. Installing the Wi-Fi card




Figure 28. Connecting the Wi-Fi antennas




Figure 29. Installing the Wi-Fi card shield




Figure 30. Removing the bottom cover




Figure 31. Installing the bottom cover




Figure 32. Opening the memory module retainer




Figure 33. Removing the memory module




Figure 34. Installing the memory module




Figure 35. Closing the memory module retainer




Figure 36. Unlocking the M.2 solid-state drive clip




Figure 37. Removing the M.2 solid-state drive




Figure 38. Installing the M.2 solid-state drive




Figure 39. Locking the M.2 solid-state drive clip




Figure 40. Removing the illuminated red dot cable




Figure 41. Installing the illuminated red dot cable




Figure 42. Removing the advanced speaker




Figure 43. Installing the advanced speaker




Figure 44. Disconnecting the front Wi-Fi antenna cable from the Wi-Fi card




Figure 45. Removing the front Wi-Fi antenna




Figure 46. Installing the front Wi-Fi antenna




Figure 47. Connecting the front Wi-Fi antenna cable to the Wi-Fi card




Figure 48. Removing the rear Wi-Fi antenna




Figure 49. Removing the antenna cover that secures the rear Wi-Fi antenna cable




Figure 50. Removing the rear Wi-Fi antenna cable




Figure 51. Installing the rear Wi-Fi antenna cable




Figure 52. Installing the antenna cover to secure the rear Wi-Fi antenna cable




Figure 53. Installing the rear Wi-Fi antenna




Figure 54. Removing the storage drive cable




Figure 55. Installing the storage drive cable




Figure 56. Loosening the screws that secure the heat sink




Figure 57. Removing the heat sink




Figure 58. Installing the heat sink




Figure 59. Tightening the screws to secure the heat sink




Figure 60. Unlocking the microprocessor socket retainer




Figure 61. Pivoting the microprocessor socket upward




Figure 62. Removing the microprocessor




Figure 63. Installing the microprocessor




Figure 64. Pivoting the microprocessor socket downward




Figure 65. Locking the microprocessor socket retainer




Figure 66. Pressing the metallic tab




Figure 67. Removing the coin-cell battery




Figure 68. Installing the coin-cell battery




Figure 69. Pressing the coin-cell battery downward




Figure 70. Removing the antenna bracket




Figure 71. Installing the antenna bracket




Figure 72. Removing the screws that secure the system board




Figure 73. Removing the system board




Figure 74. Installing the system board




Figure 75. Installing the screws to secure the system board




Figure 76. Reinstalling the computer cover




Figure 77. Reinstalling the dust shield
